



My House and Yours

After your class has read *One Hen*, take some time to compare Kojo's life in Africa with their lives in North America. This activity could start a class discussion, or you could divide the students into groups, asking each group to create a poster that presents their ideas in words and images.

Use the following topics to explore some comparisons:

- Kojo's home may be very different from your home, but all homes offer shelter from the elements and provide a place where families can gather together to eat and sleep.
- Kojo's school may be different from your school, but like you, Kojo goes to school to learn the alphabet and how to use numbers.
- The marketplace where Kojo sells his eggs is different from a supermarket, but open-air markets and supermarkets both provide a wide variety of foods to eat, and both are places where people gather in order to spend and earn money.
